Mexico City, August 26, 2011.- Some press articles are claiming that Codere owns Casino Royale in Monterrey and we feel obliged to clarify that the casino does not belong to the firm Codere Mexico, S.A. or to the company Caliente or the firm Corporación Interamericana de Entretenimiento (CIE), both of which are valued partners of Codere, separately, in different businesses in Mexico. Codere Mexico, S.A. deplores the violence that saddened all of Mexican society, since such acts are not directed against a particular industry but against the entire population.

Codere Mexico, S.A. will continue to work tirelessly in their establishments to give customers greater assurance of transparency and security so that the violence in Mexico does not strip them of their rights to entertainment.
